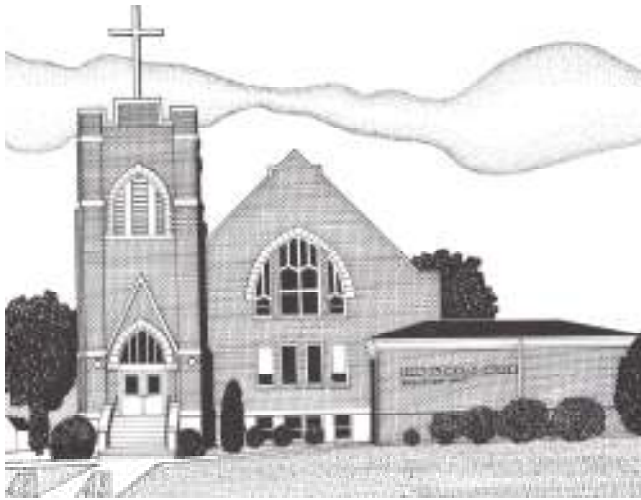

FROM PASTOR KEITH

As the School year winds down, I am struck by the many changes that occur during the life of the Church year. We soon enter our Summer Worship schedule, the Sunday School year is over, ZAP begins (If you don't know what ZAP is, read Sarah's letter in this month's newsletter.) Someone asked me the other day if things ease up during the summer. I said that there is never a slow time in the church. It is a different kind of busy-ness.

In the summer I will spend a fair amount of time meeting with couples who are getting married and the time working on wedding preparations.

I often spend the week at Luther Point Bible Camp when most of our 8th graders are at Camp. During that time I spend quite a bit of time creating and re-creating Confirmation curriculum for the up-coming year. Since I LOVE Confirmation I take notes all year long... noticing things that work well and things that do not work well. I also realize that if something is a big hit with one class of students it may not be that way for another group. Working with adolescents is rewarding and never, never dull.

This past year, we have had great attendance for our Family CONNECT service, with more parents attending than last year. One thing we will change for next year is that we are going to include Holy Communion once a month as the main focus for that CONNECT service. This will give us a chance each month to talk about Holy Communion. We will have a chance to talk about the connection of Holy Communion with the Passover meal. Don't tell the CONNECT kids... but they actually get 3 sermons every week... one is a brief meditation on the Bible reading for the day... the other 2 "sermons" usually focus on some element of the liturgy (Greeting, Kyrie, Offering, Sending, etc.), and some memory work. It is true that what we learn when we are young comes back to us when we are older.

There are some things that remain constant throughout the year: weekly preparation for worship and preaching, community service and counseling and visiting with people, Bible studies, faith development, committee meetings and work associated with that, funerals, baptisms, and life as it happens in the community and at church.

I do plan to attend a continuing education event at Luther Seminary this summer; "Rethinking Sunday Morning." The longer I live in the church, the more I realize the value of the old and the challenge of the new. We live in a society where regular worship attendance is not thought of as it once was. We need to meet people where they are and address faith in the family in new ways. Some of the old format still works for us, but the challenges of bringing faith to the world have always existed. Jesus told his disciples to GO OUT and make disciples... he never thought the only way was to open the doors of a building and let the people come to Him.

I am challenged with this, having grown up in a time when, if you wanted to do church things, you went TO the church. We are constantly thinking of new ways to reach out to the community and finding some success in that work. Whenever church leaders meet we pray that God would show us a way, AND, that we would be willing to follow where he leads.

I encourage all our church members to pray for the church and its leaders on a regular basis. God will know what to do with those He has called. God bless us all!
