## FROM PASTOR KEITH

This is an exciting time of year. The Choir is practicing for the Christmas Concert, the Sunday School is working on Songs and lines for the Christmas Program. We can hear the jingle of the Salvation Army Red Kettle Bells and Christmas music fills the air.

This is, of course, in preparation for the celebration of the birth of our Lord and Savior, Jesus, who is the Christ.

One of the Bible readings we often hear at Christmas time is from Isaiah 9... a prophecy of the expected Messiah. "For unto us a child is born, a son is given and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace."

Those words, if not made famous by the prophet Isaiah, have been sung countless times as part of Handel's "Messiah."

And to lift our voices to honor Jesus as the Prince of Peace would be a MUCH GREATER thing than to offer our praise to any earthly leader.

The First Sunday of Advent speaks of "beating swords into plowshares" (Isaiah 2:4). This too will come from the hand of God as we celebrate the Prince of Peace in our lives and in our world. This prophecy announces that feeding people will do infinitely much more good in the world than killing people. Yet... we manage to find our security in swords and shake our heads at the prophetic words of Peace.

I puzzle over the question of why we might prefer weapons over prayer. I have no insight into that puzzle... but I still believe that God is telling us a profound truth... that God can create peace in our world... but that peace will need to come from our hands... WHEN... we lay hold of the sword and place it on the anvil and pound and shape and craft something wholly other than what it was... to become something new and useful in caring for the people of the world.

Perhaps we can lift up the challenge of crafting Peace this Advent as we work side by side with the Prince of Peace Himself.

When our children are baptized, we promise that we will work with the child's parents and sponsors, and that we will "care for others and the world God made, and work for justice and peace."

We know what to do! We know how to do it! The faith exercise is to give the moment to God. When we would be tempted to strike back let us "carry our own cross" (Luke 14:27), as Jesus carried his, thereby finding new life as we give that moment to God. In fact, it is through that cross that we find peace and "put to death... hostility" (Ephesians 2:14-17).

I am thinking that a good dose of PEACE in our world would be a very welcome thing today.

We can let the Prince of Peace work His Good News through us.

As we gather to worship this Thanksgiving / Advent / Christmas time of year, may we have a heart filled with God's love and joy and peace.

May we share those gifts with the people around us. May His Kingdom come to us... and through us.

# Zion Carpet Project 2016 and... the next step!



## The Fellowship Hall is completed! THANK YOU!

Please come enjoy the NEW CARPETING in Zion's Fellowship Hall!

After 26 years the old carpet needed replacement.

Thanks to Zion's Women's Group for hosting Annual Garage Sales for raising a major portion of funding for the Fellowship Hall Carpet .

Thanks also to MANY people who have given special gifts, Memorials, Honorariums and pledges to raise sufficient funds so it is PAID IN FULL upon completion.

Our next steps... will be the Hallways by the Sunday School rooms and past the offices toward the Church Sanctuary.

This NEXT project will need to involve Asbestos Abatement. We have had professionals come in to assess these needs. Currently all asbestos is safely enclosed under the sealed, waxed floors, but 100% removal will need to be safely taken care of by professionals.

We want to assure the safety of all our Church members and guests, so we are hoping to raise sufficient funds to pay for the Asbestos Abatement AND purchase / installation of carpet in the hallway areas.

BEFORE we do this we are hoping to make major progress for final payment on the Building Repair Loan.

This loan was taken out in March of 2010 when we needed to replace the roof on the entire church building as well as repair to the Belltower. At that time we insulated needed areas and put in energy efficient lighting and windows. With well over \$300,000 in Loan we are now down to just over \$40,000.

THANKS AGAIN to all who have donated toward the building repair loan. Those donations are above and beyond your regular giving to the life and ministry of this church.

With this pledge card we are hoping that everyone can make some kind of financial contribution beyond regular support of Zion's ministry.

If you are not able at this time, your participation in other ways is a blessing to us all.

Please join us regularly in worship, Sundays at 9:00 for our more traditional worship and 10:15 for our Family CONNECT worship.
