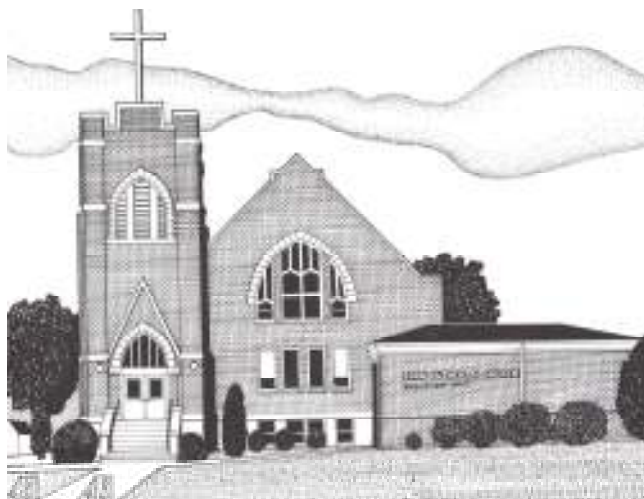

FROM PASTOR KEITH

2017 is the 500th Anniversary of the Protestant Reformation.

Martin Luther was one of MANY reformers who were taking on a Church that was wandering away from the Word of God and was becoming entrenched in "unquestionable" worldly power. The church of the day controlled civic life, owned entire villages, created unhealthy means of control over the people and held the economic strings of every person in society. There was absolutely no separation of Church and State.

One of the great inventions of the Reformation was the printing press. This made information widely available to the masses, however this revealed another problem. Most people could not read.

Another turning point for the world, during the Reformation was a strong emphasis on education. It was easy for the Church to control ignorant and superstitious citizens, but education gave people tools to learn and begin making their own decisions.

Martin Luther was a prolific writer, but one of the great gems he put together was his Small Catechism. The Small Catechism was created to be used IN THE HOME... so parents could share the basics of the Christian faith with their children.

One of Martin Luther's outspoken beliefs was to challenge the Church of the day with this question: "What does the Bible say about that?" His writings are saturated with Biblical quotes.

This year as we celebrate the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation we will become reacquainted with Martin Luther's Small Catechism.

DURING LENT: we are providing a daily devotion book, similar to the one we used last year. They will be available on the usher's table until they are gone... hopefully we have enough for ONE BOOK PER FAMILY. The outline of our Lenten Journey is in this Newsletter. Each daily devotion walks us through a small portion of the Small Catechism as we consider and pray about the meaning of the Ten Commandments, Apostles' Creed, Lord's Prayer, Confession and the Sacraments.

DURING SUNDAY SCHOOL: Our Sunday School Curriculum for 2017-2018 will focus on the Small Catechism. Thanks to Annette Sabol and Sarah Dodge for the concept and creation of this curriculum. It is already in the process.

We are hoping to create other opportunities for worship, fellowship and learning that will help us better appreciate the impact the Protestant Reformation has had and continues to have on our world.

As people of the reformation, we need to continually re-shape and re-form, through our faith, the world in which we live.

Here we go again! Starting one of the most important times of the Church Year leading up to Holy Week and Easter. Wednesday, March 1, is Ash Wednesday the beginning of the Christian Season of Lent. I asked my wife, Joan, what I should write about for March. She said well March has St. Patrick's Day. Why don't you say something about leprechauns, little people, or little things!

Traditionally Lent is a time about some very important actions in our Christian daily life. The traditional meaning of Lent revolves around 1- prayer, 2- fasting or asking for forgiveness, and 3- charitable giving. We pray and fast in order that we might be contemplative in studying the life of Christ. When we do this we find that Jesus was loving, giving, and forgiving in his relationship to other people. We want to be "Christ like" in our giving to one another. In this regard "little things" are important in what we do! I have a desk calendar in my office of sayings and events from church bulletins. There is a letter for January 17 from a young girl. It says, Dear Pastor, I'm sorry I couldn't leave more money in the offering plate. Could you please have a sermon about a raise in my allowance? That seems to me to be a "little" request which might have "large" and meaningful consequences!

Lent is about our thoughtful consideration of the "little things" and perhaps the "larger things" that we can do to share God's love and our love for one another. God's "little people" together can make a real positive difference in the life of our world. I pray that you will have a meaningful Lenten season sharing the love that you have received from God with those around you!
