FROM PASTOR KEITH

EASTER SUNDAY is Sunday, April 16. On that day, Christians all around the world will celebrate the resurrection of Jesus. That event of resurrection is what gives Jesus the title "Christ." He is Savior of the world... he is Savior of our individual lives.

Salvation is not some kind of guarantee that things will go well in this life. We certainly hope and wish for that in our daily lives, but God sees a greater picture for us... Salvation is an eternal way of life.

We celebrate that new life at many points during this life. We celebrate the new life in Holy Baptism, when we are adopted as children of God.

We celebrate the new life during the funeral of those who have lived lives of faith.

We often hear the same Bible verse during both of those celebrations of life; "We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life. If we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly also be united with him in a resurrection like his." Romans 6:4-5

We tend to think of the new life, when we enter and when we leave this life... but God wants us to enjoy the new life even now... during this life.

It is understandable that the new life is difficult to consider when there are struggles in this life. There are times that this life do not go the way we hope. We think of a host of concerns that make life unpredictable and difficult. There is pain in living and in dying. There are times of emotional pain in our relationships. So... the NEW LIFE... although it sounds appealing... at times it sounds impractical... or im-practice-able...

Yet... the practice of faith is what brings the new life to every day application.

As we read Martin Luther's Small Catechism, the Third Article of the Apostles' Creed states that we believe in the Holy Spirit. Further it states that faith is a gift of the Holy Spirit and we can not create faith by our own general or specific efforts. FAITH IS A GIFT.

What we do with that gift has a further determination in how that gift leads to new life. I remember receiving a marvelous gift... my first guitar. I could have practiced more... but I did practice some... now... 50 years later I can enjoy that gift and use it in many ways. If I had left that guitar in the case I would not know what it is like to share that gift of music with others. There are many guitars like that... still in the case... never making music.

Likewise, there are many gifts of faith that are ignored by many people through this life. Part of my calling in life is to encourage people to pull that gift of faith out of the corners of the heart and play with it. Play with faith... in good times and bad... try out the gift of faith... there is a place for God in your heart... there is a place for God in the hearts of all people... (I think... I believe...) but that gift will not even sense the new life here and now if it is not practiced.

We practice in many ways:

- when we struggle with God...
- when we are angry with God...
- when we sing with God...
- when we pray...
- when we read God's Word...
- when we invite others to join us on this journey...

- when we pray with our children...
- when we ask tough questions about the way faith and life intersect...
- when we search for answers to those tough questions...
- when we marvel at God's creation...
- when we gather at the Baptismal Font...
- when we gather for the wine and bread of Holy Communion...
- when we share a talent with others in the name of God...
- when we.....

These are all ways we can practice faith.

THIS EASTER... enter into another practice... **INVITE ONE MORE PERSON TO JOIN YOU...** to share the faith... to join the fellowship... to practice the gift of faith... the gift from the Holy Spirit... so that it may and will grow within your heart and mind and soul...

THEN... the new life can be lived today.

THEN... the new life can be enjoyed while we still live this life.

THEN... the new life is not only for when we come into this life and when we leave... it is a LIVING faith that is a true blessing for each moment of each day.

May we practice our faith... share our faith... live our faith with one another... and find that God's Holy Spirit knows what to do in us and through us... as we live in the name of Jesus... who is OUR Christ... and in whose name we live and die and live again.
