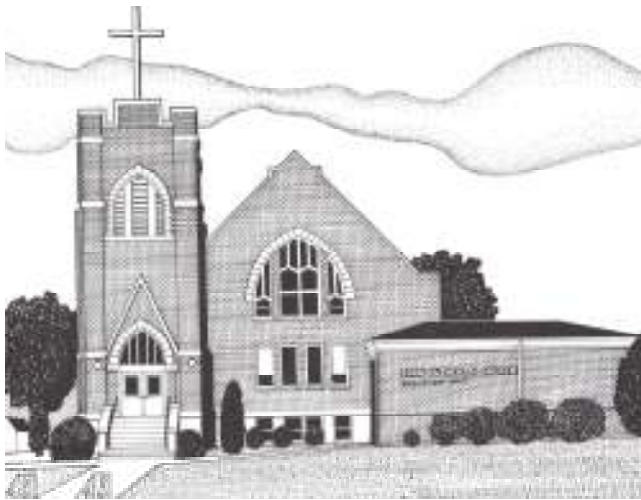


JUNE/JULY ZION LUTHERAN CHURCH NEWSLETTER -2017

FROM PASTOR KEITH

Zion Lutheran Church is connected with 197 other congregations... together we are the Northwest Synod of Wisconsin. There are 64 other similar Synods that make up our greater church, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.

Our Synod includes over 300 pastors and over 93,000 members, so when we get together it is quite a gathering. We recently gathered (April 29th) in Eau Claire for our Synod's Annual Assembly.

Many churches are recording attendance losses, but Zion is one of a few churches that have had worship growth over the past few years. I was asked to share some thoughts about why our worship attendance is up. Here is my presentation.

Our church has a gal who writes Sunday school curriculum for us... about 5 years ago she was called on a Sunday morning to substitute for one of our Sunday School teachers... in good humor she said, "I wrote the curriculum... I think I can handle it."

The curriculum that day included "The Apostles' Creed." When she asked how many of these 4th Graders knew The Apostles Creed... none of them did... she then thought to herself... they know the Creed, they just don't know that is what it is called... so she said, I will say it, then you can join in... she began... no one joined in...

The next week she told me that sad little story. So... we talked... we noted that there is no reason the kids could have known it... parents are good at bringing kids to Sunday School, but many are not part of a worshipping community. So... we tried to think outside the box... inside the box of Zion Lutheran Church.

So here we are... 2 morning worship services... and a variety of Sunday School openings throughout the building... some would say, "Same old... same old... this is the way we have always done it!", But as the old saying goes... "If it ain't broke... don't fix it."

We had adjusted that saying a bit... "If it is broke... just pretend it ain't broke... and keep driving that old wagon."

Our kids still didn't know the Creed or the Lord's Prayer and we could not pretend them into saying those precious words. We had to do something about that!

At that point, we vowed that if parents are not bringing kids to church, then we are going to bring church to the kids.

The next Sunday School year we would create a little liturgy for our Sunday School opening... and you know how kids age 3 – 16 just love little liturgies...

But we did it anyway... a Bible Camp kind of song, the Apostles' Creed, the Lord's Prayer, an offering and... what else???

We didn't know... but one thing we did know... those kids are going to learn that old Creed if it kills us...

That next year kids were dropped off for Sunday School... just like always before... but still... no parents... so we created some child and parent faith connections throughout the year and I started to tell the kids... invite your parents to join you... it is good when faith is shared within the family.

So... thank you children!

We began to call it "Family CONNECT worship."

The bold move came a couple years later, when we eliminated our latest worship service... and gave some more time to the Sunday School opening...

We took note that on some Sundays, what used to be a Sunday School opening for about 30 kids... was now a family worship service for 150 or more people.

We also realized that on some Sundays that was our largest gathering of people for worship, so we needed to put a lot more time into planning that service...

We needed to be very intentional about the atmosphere... the energy... the theology... and just a touch of crazy, weird stuff...

We are creating songs... and teaching a bit of classic rock along the way... who knew that the song, "House of the Rising Sun" could be re-worded to teach the 5th Commandment?

Who knew that a song about bar "Closing Time"... could be re-worded to be our song, "Offering Time"?

My heart jumped for joy when one of our family dad's told me that they were riding in the car one day and the song "Closing Time" came on the radio and their little girl said, "Hey Mom ... Dad... that's our church offering song!"

I believe families enjoy doing meaningful things together... including sharing their faith...

For many... sitting quietly for an hour in church is a painful experience... and just because we all survived it... doesn't mean that recipe for worship will work for everyone

We are finding that 20 minutes is time for us to have some fun, to hear God's Word enjoy some music and provide faith-food for thought.

Beside this... it is not just young families who enjoy "Family CONNECT"... some of our 80 and 90 year olds feel energized by being around children. They get a chance to meet children in our community and as we continue to connect... we provide other opportunities for our Sunday School classes to serve our fellowship time... everyone loves it. We are feeling more like a church family... and children are inviting their friends... parents are telling other parents...

And God welcomes us to worship...

We are finding that we can sing a new song in a new way and we believe that God loves the buzz of conversation during "Offering Time"... and during Holy Communion... it is the sweet sound of families in fellowship.

Thank you for allowing me the opportunity of sharing.

It was fun to share at our Synod Assembly. I also want to thank THIS congregation for opening your hearts and minds to new ways of sharing the faith. You are getting to know more of these children and their families as they share in serving our Fellowship times. We are blessed to be a blessing. We are taking a summer hiatus from Family CONNECT worship, but in the fall, I invite EVERYONE to experience a Family CONNECT worship time. In some ways we are 2 distinct congregations now... but thank God that the Word is being shared and more and more people are hearing and sharing and teaching as we bring Christ into the lives of many people.
