


# ZION LUTHERAN CHURCH MAY 2017 NEWSLETTER

## FROM PASTOR KEITH

We continue the work of renovation here at Zion. As I am writing this, the asbestos abatement is underway. Almost hidden away in the office, doors are taped shut, the sounds of removal just on the other side of the door.

We received an e-mail this past Tuesday that the abatement work would begin on the following Monday if we wanted to accept the bid. Our Congregation Council met that evening and, as we looked over the 3 bids we had received, we said, "Let's do it!" The plan was in the works.

I want to offer words of thanks to the many, many people who are making this possible... beginning with the women who have organized our great Church Rummage Sale and have provided a majority of the funding for the new carpet installation. AND... thanks to everyone who had donated items to that sale. AND... thanks to all who have purchased items large or small and for donations of time and food and countless hours of sorting and arranging... I will not name names... because if I list 30 people I know I will miss 20 others.

I also want to thank people who have given memorial gifts and other special donations to help with this project. We are not getting all of the classrooms done at this time, but there will be another push to finish this some years down the road.

I also want to thank our Confirmation kids and parents and Council members and staff and others who helped this past Sunday after our Family CONNECT worship service, for all the prep work of removing vinyl base and doors and emptying rooms... moving fire proof file cabinets is hard work... I hope everyone's backs are in good shape today. I didn't count but I am guessing there were around 30 people??? and in an hour and a half all the prep work was done.

There is a spirit of community and family when people work together. There is something good about coming together... where all do some... and none do it all... there is joy in working fellowship. As we were working, someone said, "God's Work... Our Hands!" WOW! That's it... who ever knew that moving a file cabinet is God's Work? Who ever knew that pulling vinyl treads off some old stairs is God's Work? There is something in the Lutheran tradition about "vocation." Vocation is doing the work God has given you to do. We have talked about Fruits of the Spirit this year in Sunday School. We have talked about Spiritual Gifts at other times. These are talents, interests, personality traits that make each one of us uniquely who we are. It is a Biblical belief that God makes each one of us special and these Gifts from God are a part of our unique make-up.

So... as you use a talent that God has given you... that is vocation. So, this week... whatever you do... think of that job as doing what God has created you to do... and when we work together... that is what the Bible calls "The Body of Christ!" working together... cooperating... sharing time and energy and creativity... is the Body of Christ.

We are Christians... together... alone each one of us is a child of God... loved and claimed through Holy Baptism... but together... something special happens. We have seen that in so many ways here at Zion. Sharing smiles and tears... sharing all that comes our way... we are FAMILY!

This summer, let's not lose touch. Let's continue to come together as we are able to share the joy and love and nurture of fellowship. Blessings to us all!

## FROM PASTOR ANDY BOE

Jesus' appearance to his disciples recorded in the Gospel of John is important to us. In the reading for the Second Sunday of Easter Peter, the disciple and witness to the resurrection, centers on the resurrection as it brings new life to all. Peter also says that this new life is "living hope." I understand this living hope as the daily presence of Jesus as the Risen Christ. This presence began as Jesus appeared to the disciples in the locked room on the evening of his resurrection. Peter describes Jesus physical appearance as real, and later Thomas is offered the opportunity to touch Jesus' wounds. However, for me the living hope comes in Jesus' words. Three times in the Gospel Jesus says to the disciples "Peace be with you." This peace is the presence of God's well-being in our spiritual, physical, economic, emotional, and social life! Jesus cares about his disciples in this expression of living - daily - hope. Jesus also says to the disciples, and to us, "Receive the Holy Spirit."
