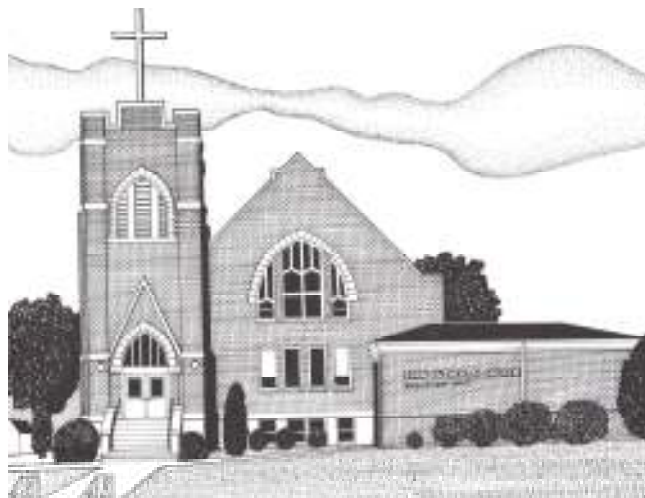


JUNE/JULY ZION LUTHERAN CHURCH NEWSLETTER -2018

FROM PASTOR KEITH

My office just got spiffed up!
New carpet, paint on the walls. Come and check out my new accent wall! YAY! Thanks Jim!
And as I am slowly getting things back in my office, I find that there is a whole bunch of stuff that is just STUFF... not valuable to me anymore... just STUFF... and I am doing a little bit each day to sort and throw and recycle and re-arrange.
That is rather a reflection of a life of faith.
Have you ever found that you have hung on to some things in life way to long? A while back someone told me about an old anger... they had almost put it aside... but never quite. It would jab them every once in a while and would provoke again and stir up old resentments... it had been on a shelf in their heart for years and a life-event caused them to re-think why that old anger still pained them so much.
They knew why the original pain was there... the loss was deep... the hurt seemed to have no end in sight... but slowly it found its way to a little hiding place in their heart.
But it was still there. Another life-event caused that person to sort through all the old stuff of life... and there it was... it had not gone away... it would not leave... but the recurring hurt was causing further hurt... and in an "A-HA!" kind of moment... the journey toward freedom and joy began.
Trusting God again was not easy, but they found that God had never really been the problem. Holding on to pain... that was the problem.
Sharing the story with others was part of the path toward healing, but when it was time to re-arrange life... that old anger quite simply had to go.
Prayer led the way to humility... then their prayer led them to silence... a peaceful silence... a peace bringing silence. I recalled for them the time Jesus was praying in the Garden, only to find that his sleepy headed friends were no help at all. There is something of silent... wordless prayer that can be healing and peace bringing.
In that silence they came to understand that God was with them... always with them... not causing harm but wanting to help put life back together again.
The re-arranging meant that their life would look different... but it would be for them a new life. A new start. The old anger could pass away and make room for peace. But only in their humble silence did they find that peace.
Re-arranging my office reminded me of that encounter. Things look different. Some things are gone. Some things remain. And it makes little difference in the location of my desk, but for that person who re-arranged their life... it meant everything. A new life... a new hope... a new relationship with God. A new love for themselves... even the hope of forgiveness that might one day be shared.
We all come to times in life where we need to re-arrange some things. Do it a little bit at a time... but do it.
Don't feel like you need to control all the outcome. God knows what to do.
Perhaps this summer, we can all take some quiet time to spend with God... quiet in prayer... quiet in fellowship... quiet in peace. God knows each one of us! A slow quiet inventory might be just the ticket. Hold on to what build life up. Release those things that bring us down.
God will reveal Himself to us in ways that bring about new life... each day...
Take time for quiet... and pray.
Peace be with you!

Sale Queen title.

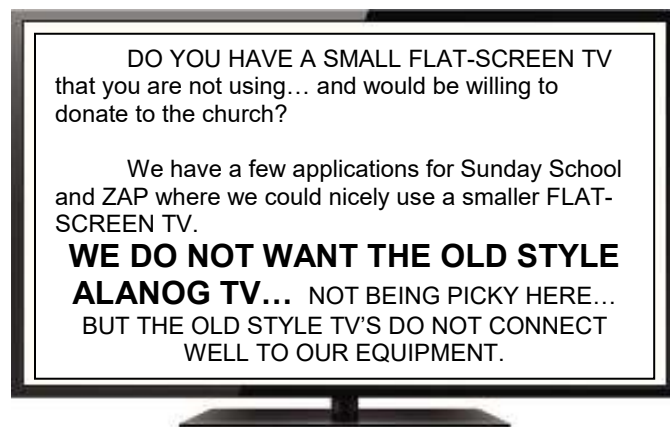
For the past few years Lois and Elizabeth Leon have
