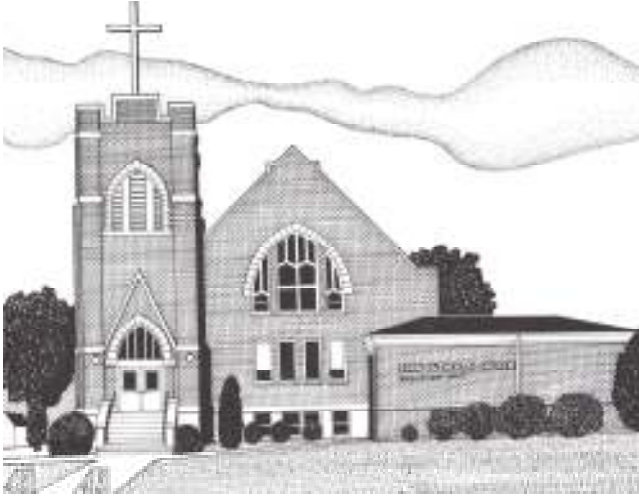


# OCTOBER ZION LUTHERAN CHURCH NEWSLETTER - 2018

There are a lot of wonderful things about being young... I sort of remember it if I think of it long enough. Being young... you just get in and out of cars... you don't have to stand there and shake your bones and stretch your limbs and try to limber up so you can take a step or two.

I can still get down on the floor... AND get up again... but I am sure one day I will get down and then look for a chair to hold on to as I get up.

Young people can go and go and go and go and go... and then with one long night's rest be ready to go and go and go... again. But as I get older... one sleepless night takes more than one good night's rest to catch up.

Another wonderful thing I have noticed about young people... at least young people here at Zion... is that they invite people to join them in worship! WHAT?! That's correct! Just about every Sunday young people are inviting other people... friends, family members... to join them in church.

This is the work of a disciple.

Recently reading in 3 John... you know I LOVE 1 John... and if I could have only 1 chapter of the Bible... 1 John 4 would be in the running... but 3 John verse 8 says, "We ought therefore to show hospitality to such people so that we may work together for the truth."

almost paid off... having paid for Reroofing the entire  
building, Belltower / capstones repair, insulating, new  
windows, landscaping to eliminate basement water leaking,  
sidewalk replacement, heating boiler replacement, Johnson  
Street assessment, parking lot re-pavement, (and other

us.

THE NEXT STEP IS... Fellowship Hall Air
